## From the mayor's desk

The Town's 2007 Haymarket Holiday Celebration, on December 1, 2007, was themed to honor our Armed Forces that were stationed overseas. During that celebration, children created gift bags filled with goodies. Some items in the bags were playing cards, toothpaste, aspirin, and many other miscellaneous items. These bags, along with a US flag, were sent to The 2nd Brigade, 9th Iraqi Army Division MTT, lead by Colonel Phil Swinford, a resident of Greenhill Crossing. Colonel Swinford returned home for the holidays bearing the flag that we had sent. The Colonel reported to Mayor Stutz that on Saturday, December 22, he personally carried the flag on a combined US Iraqi patrol to Salman Pak, Iraq. During that operation that patrol encountered small arms fire from anti-Iraqi Insurgents, thus this flag has truly been carried by US soldiers during combat. The flag will be flown at the Town's museum, proudly. Thank you Colonel Swinford.

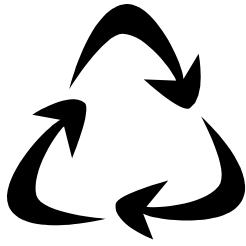
Jessica feels one of her greatest accomplishments in her career has been the ability to give back to the Haymarket community.
