Greetings Neighbors!

2009 is fast approaching its Fall season and we have many things to look back on, some items to look forward to and some issues to help resolve. In the "things to look back on" category, we held the last summer concert on August 15th and, as a whole, the series was received with more interest this year. The Town Manager and his staff did a great job lining up performers and the venue! We look forward to next summer's schedule and if you know a good local band, or are part of one yourself, let Jennifer, Sherrie, or Gene know. This summer also saw the passage of our new budget for the next fiscal year and the ending of last year's budget cycle. Whereas many cities and towns around the state and the nation ended their fiscal years in the red, we managed to end it in the black. Many, many thanks to our town manager Gene, our treasurer Jim, and the rest of the staff for their extra-thrifty office policies and practices.

For "things to look forward to" we can expect the intersection of Routes 15 and 55 to be completed soon. As part of this work, we will also be seeing a new drug store in town. H1N1 VIRUS UPDATE

Based on the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Prince William County Health Department the Town is taking steps to limit staff exposure to the H1N1 virus in public buildings such as our Town Hall/Police Building.

The basic steps are those which have been recommended by the CDC: get flu shots as soon as possible and get the H1N1 vaccination when they are available; wash hands thoroughly and often; use a sanitizer to clean shared items in the office such as telephones; and, limit contact with the public. To that end we have temporarily stopped providing Notary and Fingerprinting services at the Police building.
