

Town of Haymarket Youth in Government Program 2023

Description:

The Town of Haymarket is hosting a Youth in Government Program (the "Program") for local students. The Program will be open to 15 participants in grades 6-8. The Town of Haymarket and Town Council are hosting this program with the intent to provide our youth of Haymarket an opportunity to voice their opinion and share a role in the decision-making on the issues that arise in our Town.

Mission:

Our mission is to help engage the youth of our community in being more involved and informed on what is happening in their local Government and helping them begin to understand the importance of the roles they have in strengthening and growing their Town.

Application Process:

All applications will be reviewed, and roles selected by Town Staff and Council Members. All participants will be notified on Monday, October 2, 2023, if they've been accepted into the Program and which role they've been assigned. Attendance at each meeting is mandatory. Town employees and select Council Members of Town Hall will be in attendance during the meeting dates outlined below. Each meeting is essential as the group will work closely with each other to address local issues and brainstorm how to work together to solve the problem. Parents are welcome, not required, to observe the meetings but are asked not to participate during the meetings. October 30, 6:00-7:30 "Sample Work Session"

November 6, 6:00-7:30 "Sample Town Council Meeting and Vote"

Council Members and Staff Include:

Mayor	The Mayor is an elected official who may have specific duties and responsibilities. The Mayor evaluates the situation, asks questions of town/city staff & Council, gets input from other community members and decides what is right for the Town.
Vice Mayor	The Vice Mayor is an elected official whose role is to work alongside the Mayor, as well as fill in when the Mayor is not able. Vice Mayor evaluates the situation, asks questions of town/city staff, gets input from members of the community, and decides what is right for the community.
Council Members (5)	The role of Councilmember is to evaluate the situation, ask questions of town/city staff, get input from members of the community, and decide what is right for the community.
Chief (2)	The Chief of Police is a member appointed by Councilmembers. The Chief's role is to oversee the officers and all aspects of the town/city police department.
Town Manager/Planner (2)	The town/city manager is an official appointed by the Council to administer the town/city's operations. The Town Manager works closely with Councilmembers.
Town Treasurer (2)	The town/city Treasurer's role is to manage the town funds. The Treasurer works closely with the Town Manager and Councilmembers to determine the Town budget, where money is coming in and what it is going to be spent on.
Town Clerk (2)	The town/city Clerk is the record keeper for the town. The Clerk's role is to take minutes of the monthly Council Meetings, including what special interest groups are attending the meeting, what each group spoke about and how each Councilmember votes.

Scenario:

The Town of Haymarket is considering the current needs of our community park which is used by Town residents and our greater community. The Town sent out a recent survey asking residents for suggestions on what they would like to see at Town Park. We need to review the survey answers and determine what's in the Town's best interests. What should we do with Town Park? Do we expand the playground, add more kid-friendly features or perhaps a dog park? Help us decide what the Town's needs are and make the decision.
