Polar Plunge 2025

On Saturday, February 15, 2025, Chief Sibert, along with many other participants, took part in the 2025 Polar Plunge! Over \$130,000 was raised to support the athletes of Special Olympics Virginia. The event was held at Leesylvania State Park in Woodbridge, Virginia. A huge thank you to everyone who participated and contributed to this amazing cause!

Accident on Jefferson Street

On March 4, 2025, a driver struck an electric pole in the 6600 block of Jefferson Street, across from Cupcake Heaven. The impact caused a power outage that lasted approximately 7 hours before crews were able to restore service. The driver was transported to UVA Health, where he was treated and later released. The driver was cited for Reckless Driving and Distracted Driving.



Investigation Into Illegal Dumping on Jordan Lane

The Town Police are currently investigating an illegal dumping issue on Jordan Lane. Officers had noticed that issues with dumping on the vacant lot had been escalating. Haymarket Police worked with the landowner to address the situation. The landowner agreed to assist by blocking access to the lot and posting "No Trespassing" signs. The landowner was happy to assist, further mitigating the issue by cleaning up the lot and adding video surveillance cameras. HPD decided to install its own surveillance camera while the landowner was making preparations for concrete barriers.

On February 23, 2025 at approximately 4:58pm, while the lot was being cleaned, two males entered the lot in a black Ford 4X4 Platinum F-150 pickup truck. The two suspects dumped a used sofa and mattress onto the property before leaving.

Following initial leads, Chief Sibert decided to release the surveillance images. Shortly after, Washington D.C. Fox News contacted the department and ran the story which aired on March 10, 2025. 


New Crosswalk Added on Washington Street





First Quarter Town Council Updates

- Appointed Matt Gallagher as Vice Mayor.
- Liaison Appointments:
 - Finance: Joe Pasanello, Alexander Beyene
 - Business: Matt Gallagher
 - Community Outreach: Mary Ramirez
 - ARB: Ken Luerssen
 - Planning Commission: Justin Baker
- Appointed Dave Caposella to fill the Planning Commission vacancy.
- Nominated Jerome Gonzalez for the Board of Zoning Appeals.
- Continued discussion on Special Use Permit (SUP) for 2nd drive-thru lane at Chick-fil-A; will be revisited on April 7th.
- Adopted Resolution 2025-001 to fund demolition of the Town Park House; demolition to be completed on April 7, 2025.
- FY26 Budget Work Sessions began March 31st, with a draft budget presentation and the proposed real estate tax rate presented by Town Treasurer Roberto Gonzalez.
- Held public hearing on Special Use Permit for religious assembly at 14600 Washington Street; decision deferred until April 7th.

Looking Ahead

- April 7th:** Public hearing on FY26 Real Estate Tax Rate, presentation of Child Abuse Awareness Month proclamation to Dominion Woman's Club, and quarterly update from Prince William County Supervisor Bob Weir.

FY2026 BUDGET SCHEDULE

3/3	Regular Council Meeting - Staff will submit the first draft of the budget
3/31	Monthly Work Session - Staff will go through proposed FY2026 budget and answer any questions from council
4/7	Review FY2026 budget; discuss any changes if requested from prior meetings. Hold Public Hearing for Real Estate Tax rates & Fee Schedule
4/28	Monthly Work Session/Budget Work Session - Review proposed FY2026 budget with council that will be discussed at public hearing on May 05, 2025
5/5	Public Hearing Proposed FY2026 budget will be held. This will be the opportunity for the public to comment on proposed FY2026 budget
6/2	Regular Council Meeting - Council will vote on proposed FY2026 budget that would take effect on July 01, 2025 to June 30, 2026

The FY2026 budget will be effective from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026. It directs the Town's daily activities and supports larger capital improvement projects. The public is encouraged to review the meeting agendas and provide feedback either in writing or during the meetings. BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWAL

DUE APRIL 30, 2025

The Town of Haymarket Business, Professional, and Occupational License (BPOL) renewals for 2025 are due by April 30th. Renewal notices were mailed in February to businesses holding a license with the Town. Please be sure to submit your applications and payments on time to avoid a penalty of 10% of the tax for late filing or payment. The business license fee is based on gross receipts for the calendar year 2024. Please email the Town Treasurer or Deputy Clerk with any questions or for more information.

TOWN HISTORY THE RUST-PICKETT HOUSE



The Rust-Pickett House, dating back to at least 1901, is in the older farm home style common in Haymarket in the late 1800s. It was sold in 1916 to Albert B. Rust, a prominent civil leader, who lived there with his wife, Wilhelmina Tullross, daughter of Dr. Tullross who practiced medicine out of Red House Ordinary. The house had multiple owners through the mid-20th century, including J.W. Garrett, the Sinclairs, the Prices, and the Terrills. In 1960, it was sold to Walter Mason Pickett, Haymarket's mayor from 1963-1975, after whom the house is also named. The house was briefly owned by Alan C. Gossom, who owned much of the town, in the early 1980s but returned to Pickett's estate by the decade's end. In 1989, the house was sold to Jack and Lynda Farr, who opened a business called Hairmarket, marking the building's first commercial use. In 1995, the business was transferred solely to Lynda Farr. After relocating to South Carolina in 2017, the Rust-Pickett House was the site of Exit Heritage Realty and, as of 2023, is home to Thrive Med Spa.
