Haymarket Day is ALMOST here!

The Haymarket Police Department would like to remind everyone of several upcoming events for October 2025- most notably, HAYMARKET DAY, which is Saturday, October 18!

Road Closures & Traffic Notices

Letters detailing road closures and traffic changes will go out to all residents and businesses soon. Please note there are some changes that residents and businesses need to be aware of this year.

Old Carolina & Heathcote Blvd:

- The most impactful change will be at the intersection of Old Carolina Road and Heathcote Boulevard.
- In past years, this intersection remained open and allowed access up to Jordan Lane. This year, **Old Carolina will be restricted to residents and business traffic only.**
- The eastbound turn lane on Heathcote Blvd toward Old Carolina **will be closed**
- The **straight-through lane** on Old Carolina on the north side of Heathcote Blvd **will also be closed.**
- Residents and business traffic wishing to enter town on Old Carolina must turn left **from the westbound lane** of Heathcote Blvd. Police officers will be vetting traffic in that turn lane.
- Non-residents will be asked to continue westbound toward Route 15 or to make a U-turn and head east on Heathcote.

Alexandra's Keep & Villages of Haymarket:

- This year, **Bleight Drive at Washington Street will be closed.**
- Residents will be permitted to **use the grass area near the old ballfields** at the QBE building to exit through the QBE parking lot.
- Officers will be on-site to assist and direct traffic.
- A marked, **coned driving area** will be set up to ensure safe navigation across the grass.

Parade Route & Breakdown Area:

- The parade will **begin at the QBE building and end at Jefferson Street.**
- When parade participants reach Jefferson Street, they will **turn left** and break down their floats between Washington Street and Jefferson Street alongside the Hilton Garden Inn.

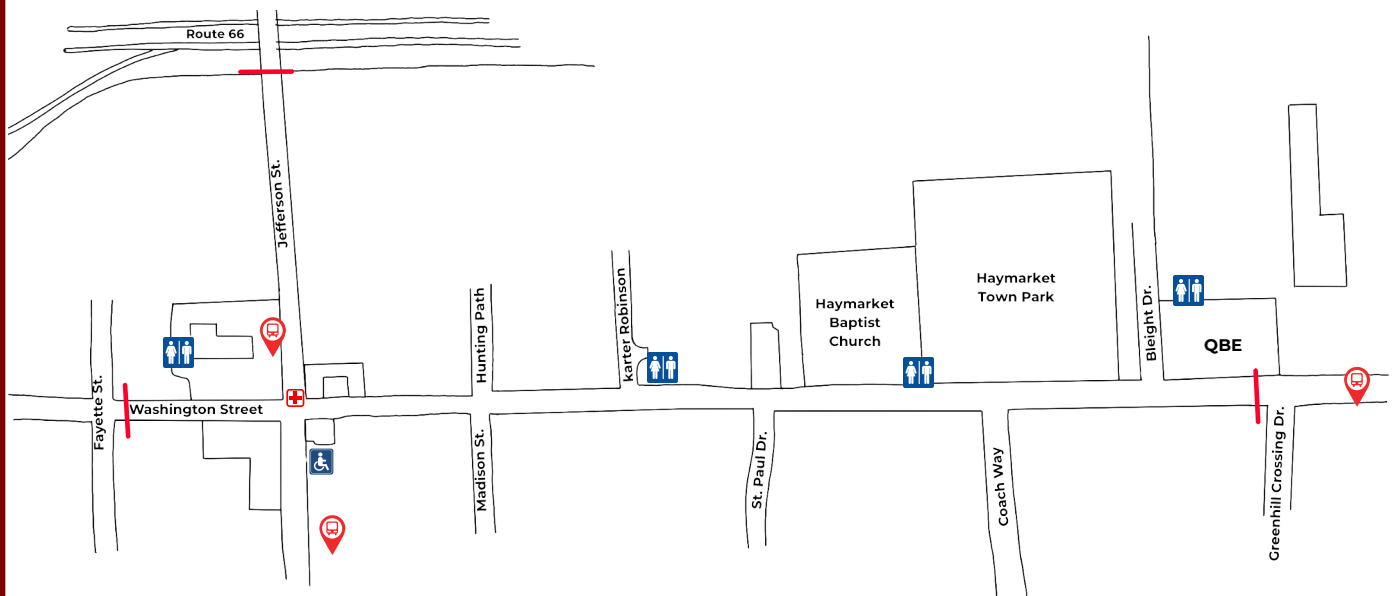

HAYMARKET DAY MAP



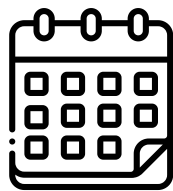

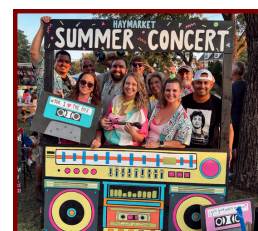

Fourth Quarter Town Council Updates

- Jerome Gonzalez was re-appointed to the Planning Commission for a new term (July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2029). Jeffrey Kress was appointed to the Planning Commission, filling a vacant seat.
- The Town Council has directed staff to move forward with a comprehensive RFP for the new Town Park Pavilion, including restrooms, parking, and full site planning. Public input opportunities will be announced in the coming months.
- Significant flooding issues were reported in the Robinson Paradise subdivision. Town Staff has visited the site, confirmed grading and drainage issues, and is working with the homeowners, contractors and Prince William County officials to address the issues.
- Councilmembers paid tribute to Supervisor Bob Weir, a beloved leader and advocate for our community, recognizing his contributions to the town, county, and state. A proclamation was presented at the September Town Council Meeting and can be viewed online at townofhaymarket.org/meetings.
- Join the Architectural Review Board, a volunteer board that plays a vital role in reviewing design proposals, preserving the Town's character and helping make decisions that overall influence the Town's appearance.

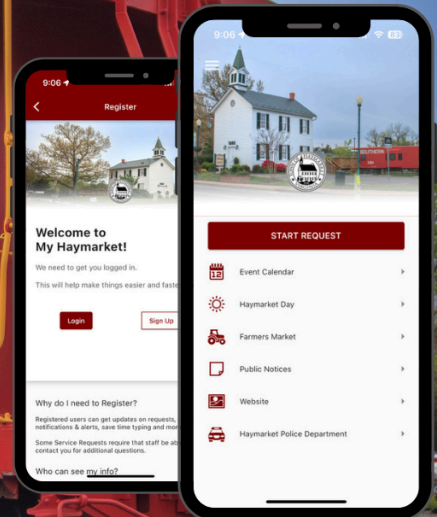

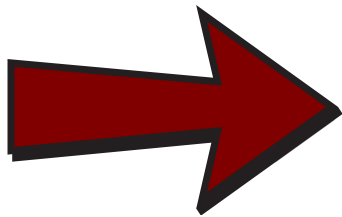

EXTRA YARD WASTE



Tree limbs should be bundled with rope or twine, and no longer than 4ft long or 3in thick.

Place grass clippings in biodegradable bags or in a personal container that's marked "Yard Waste."

Keep all your containers 3ft apart from each other, and 10ft apart from any other obstacles.

Bagged or bundled items must not exceed 50 lbs.

TOWN HISTORY

THE OLD POST OFFICE - 2025 TOWN ORNAMENT



What we now call The Haymarket Post Office has served this community in many ways. The land was purchased by George A. Hulfish in 1883 and the structure was erected in 1885 with a recorded tax assessment of \$350.

It is believed that the building was used for both a business and residence until the early 1930's. Court records refer to the building as "the drug store property" in a 1932 deed. The drug store served as a social spot for all ages selling ice cream, sodas, milkshakes, sandwiches, and sundries. In 1945 the property was purchased and converted to the Post Office by Cary Smith. Mr. Smith served as the Town's Postmaster from 1933 - 1959. The building continued its use as the Haymarket Post Office until March 1980 when, after sale, it reverted to its historic business and residential uses. In March 2000 the Town of Haymarket purchased the property from Alan C. Gossom. By 2005, much needed repairs forced the Town to close the doors on The Haymarket Post Office. In 2012, renovations began on the vacant building. The original foundation remains intact and has been secured and encased by an exterior wall. The metal roof was replaced, the front doors replicated, and, where possible, the clapboard siding was restored.

2013 begins a new era for this building. The doors have been reopened in hopes of another century of history to fill these walls of what will always be known as...
