Haymarket is located at 38°48'46"N 77°38'6"W (38.812670, -77.635084).^[18] Haymarket is located in the Piedmont region of Virginia, sitting at the base of Bull Run Mountains.

According to the United States Census Bureau, the town has a total area of 0.5 square miles .

The greater area of Haymarket (ZIP code 20169) has a total area of 32.2 square miles with 0.2 square miles of water.

Haymarket is built on land that used to be hunting grounds of the western Iroquois nations, who came from the New York and Pennsylvania area around the Great Lakes. They used hunting paths through the land until 1722, when they made a treaty with the colonies of Virginia and New York to move into the Blue Ridge Mountain region.

Due to the hunting paths, this location, and later the town, were given the nickname *The Crossroads*. The town of Haymarket began to be developed and built after the American Revolutionary War, formally founded in 1799 on the land of William Skinker. The Virginia General Assembly gave Skinker the rights to lay out the town, which he drew to consist of 13 streets and 140 lots. Shortly after, a clerk's office and jail were constructed in 1801, as the town had been selected as the site of what is now a district court. The town owed its early development to business and trade associated with the regular court sessions.

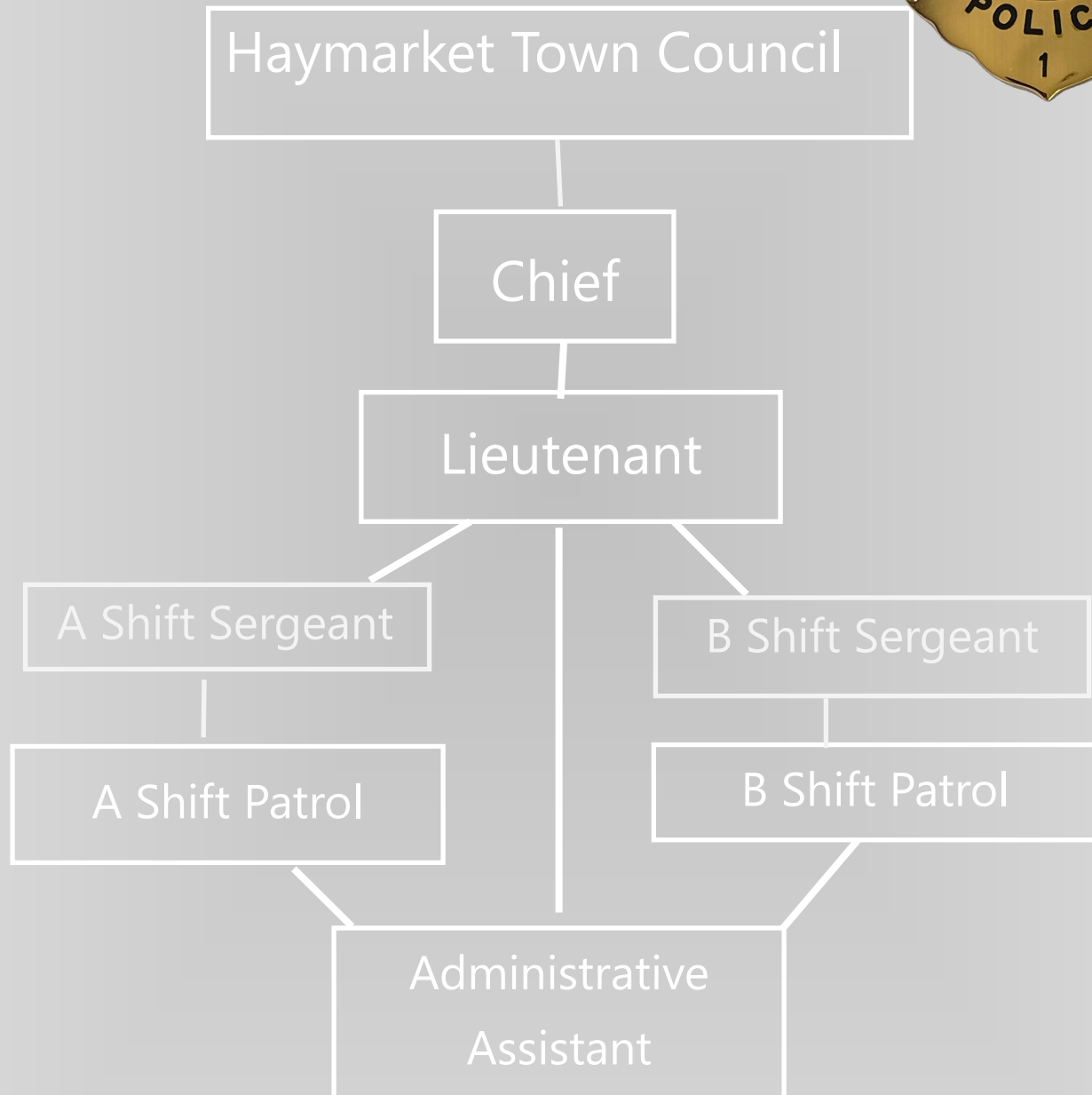

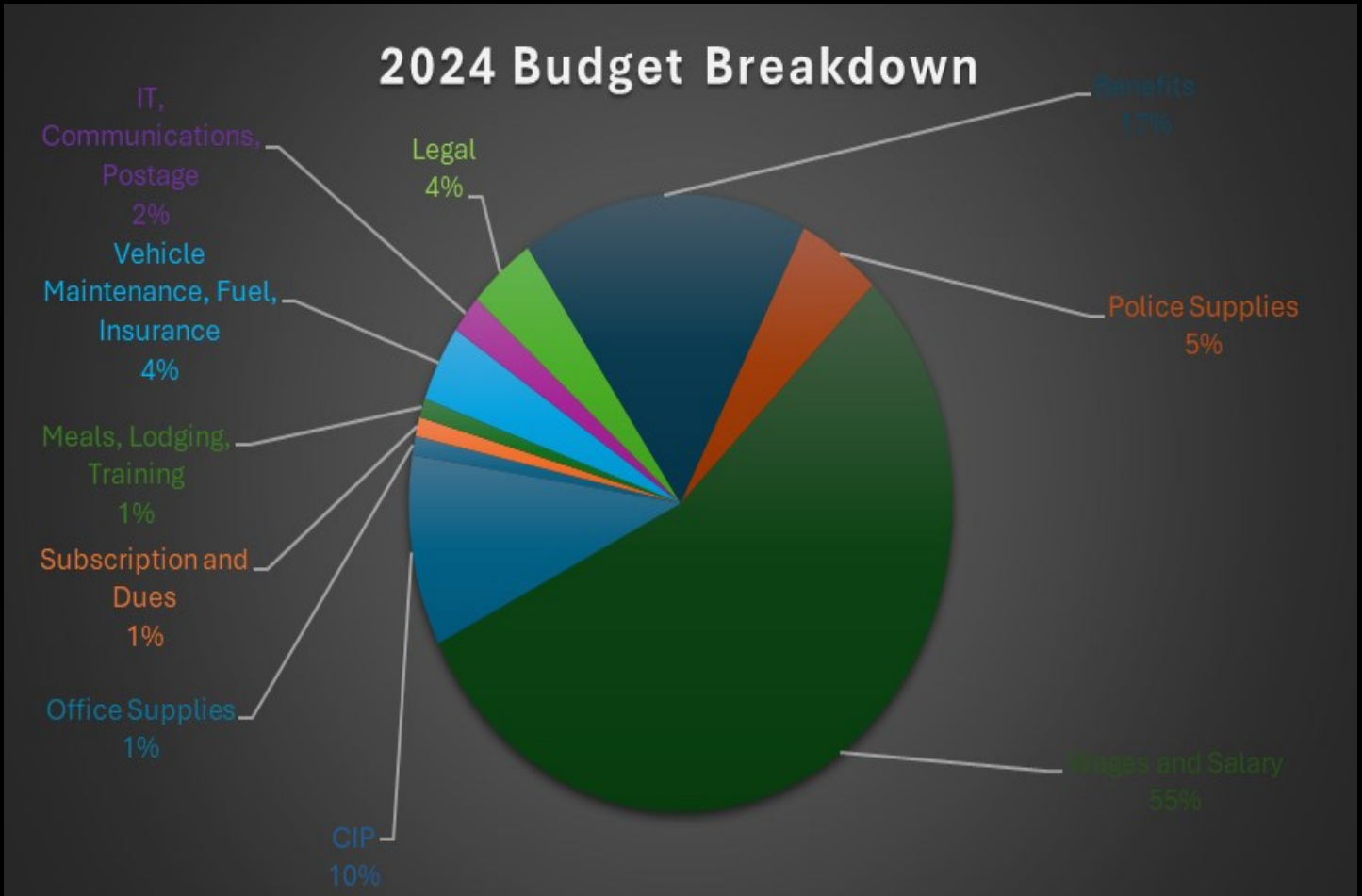

The Haymarket Police Department conducted a total of 884 traffic stops resulting in 502 uniform summons and 555 warnings being issued during 2024.

2024 Departmental Accomplishments



1. Grant applications for the 2022 LOLE grant and 2022 DCJS ARPA grant were both approved. In the amount of \$12,522. These funds were used to purchase two Motorola portable radios for Officers' communication needs.
2. The Haymarket Police Department entered into a MOU with Prince William County Police Department for the use of the Mike Pennington Scenario-Based Training Center as needed.
3. The Haymarket Police Department took place in the annual "Polar Plunge" fundraising event. The event raised over \$140,000 for Special Olympics.
4. A grant application for the 2023 LOLE grant in the amount of \$622 was approved and used to purchase portable radio earpieces and batteries.
5. The Haymarket Police Department held one blood drive last year that yielded 38 units of blood.
6. The Haymarket Police Department took part in the annual "St. Baldrick's Day" fundraising event. The event raised several thousand dollars for childhood cancer.
7. The Haymarket Police Department held its first annual seniors' educational summit on April 25, 2024 from 10am to 2pm. This event educated seniors on current criminal trends that target the elderly along with providing information and services seniors often need. Over 250 attendees and 59 resource vendors were present. Lt. Governor Winsome Earle-Sears was the guest speaker.
8. The Haymarket Police Department applied and was approved for the 2024-2025 DMV NHTSA Grant. This grant compensates officers for traffic detail work involving Speed Selective Enforcement and Occupant Protection Enforcement. The grant also allows for community engagement regarding traffic education and the purchase of equipment. The total amount approved was \$28,173. One new speed sign for the east side of town, along with 2 new RADAR units were purchased in October and November grant funds in the amount of \$10,729. The total breakdown is as follows: \$15,960 for employee hours worked on saturation patrols; \$684 for employee hours worked during community collaboration events; \$800 for employee training; and \$20,729 for equipment.
9. The Haymarket Police Department entered into an agreement with Motorola Solutions P1 for a new Records Management System. This synergy will better assist in solving crime while also providing officers with valuable information.
10. The Haymarket Police department took part in both the Spring and Fall Drug Take-back day events collecting over 750 pounds of unused prescription drugs.
11. A new overnight evidence holding locker was installed in the Police Department providing an upgrade in security for evidence and property.
12. A grant application for DCJS 559 funds was approved for the Haymarket Police Department in the amount of \$37,790.

13. Officers engaged local community members at the end of the school year with a balloon fight and ice cream social.
14. An Open House was held in June 2024 where several groups of children and parents were welcomed into the police department while interacting with the community's police officers.
15. The Haymarket Police Department held one woman's self-defense class.
16. The Haymarket Police Department and Town of Haymarket installed a new speed sign on the west side of town. This sign can archive important data such as traffic volume, average speed, and high traffic patterns.
17. The Haymarket Police Department held its annual National Night Out. The event was attended by 800-1000 community members who were able to enjoy free Chic-fil-A sandwiches, music, Mission Bar-BBQ, and Papa John's Pizza while interacting with the Haymarket Police Officers.
18. The Haymarket Police Department supported all local events including Haymarket Day, Christmas in Haymarket, Halloween, Summer Concert, and the weekly Farmer's Market.
19. The Haymarket Police Department added two new positions to cover increasing calls for service. Officer Wayne Monse and Officer Victoria Kalisz were hired in October and November. Both Officers left after 4-6 weeks of service in the Town of Haymarket. Officer Monse went back to his original department and Officer Kalisz left for personal reasons. Officer Scott Madigan and Officer Trevor Rick were hired in December and will start in January 2025.
20. The Haymarket Police Department promoted two officers to Sergeant. Sgt. Charles "Chipp" Burgoon with over 10 years of law enforcement experience and Sgt. Donald Finley with over 15 years of experience are each leading a patrol shift.
21. The Haymarket Police Department assisted local families that lost their house in an explosion. Supplies, clothing, and food were collected in the Police Department Lobby.
22. The Haymarket Police Department assisted families in Virginia and North Carolina that were affected by flooding.
23. The Haymarket Police Department and "Santa Claus" handed out over 300 stuffed animals to local youth during their annual "Operation Santa Claus".
24. The Haymarket Police Department assisted a local boy scout troop by collecting Toys for Tots for their campaign and continues to be a drop-off location for Boxes of Basics.
25. The Haymarket Police Department has and continues to support NHTSA Campaigns such as Click or Ticket, Drive Sober or get Pulled Over, Impaired Driving, Operation Crash Reduction, Pedestrian Safety Month, Distracted Driving, and Child Seat Safety.

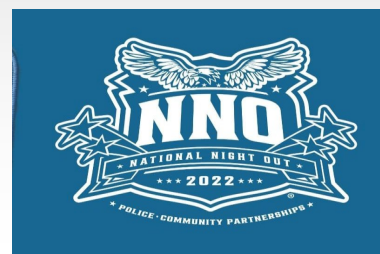

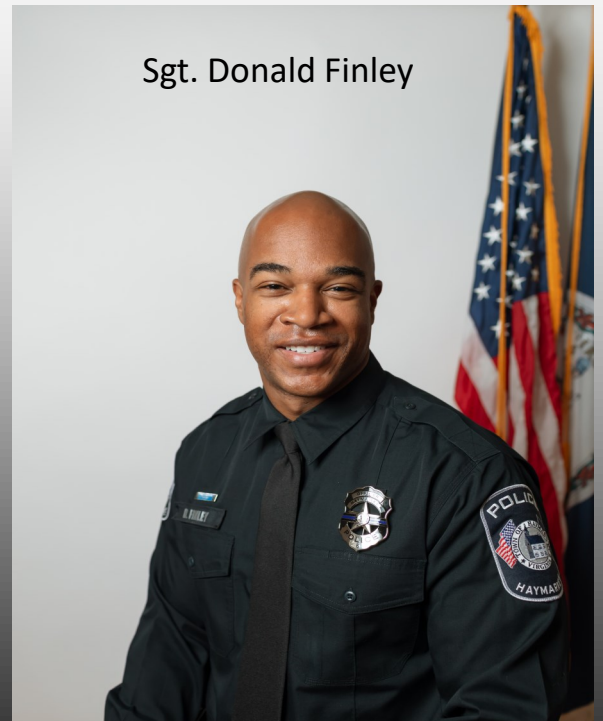

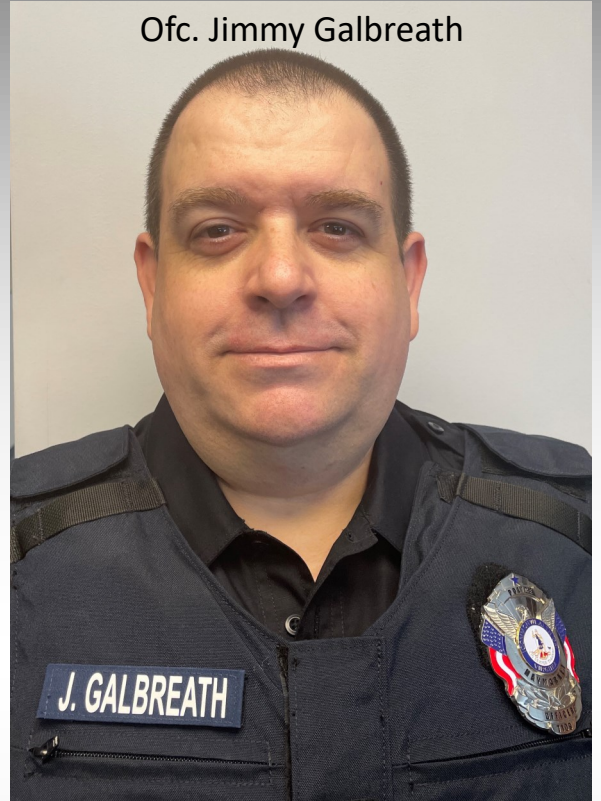
