HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETING:MAY 15, 1989

All members of the Haymarket Town Council were present at the May 15, 1989 Town Council Meeting with the exception of Councilman Richard Bird, when it began at 8 p.m., with a Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$75,758.24 in the General Account at the end of April, 1989. The Treasurer reported some bills to be paid, they were;

1. HAYMARKET SERVICE CENTER, WORK ON POLICE CRUISER --- \$69.28
2. GOSSOM'S HARDWARE, ITEMS POLICE DEPT. & T. H. \$ 9.73
3. EMBASSY AUTO WASH, WASHING POLICE CRUISER \$5.25
4. OFFICE OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS, REPAIR, POLICE RADIO \$215.10

Councilman Ron Hancock made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Councilman John Kapp, the motion carried unanimously in a Roll Call Vote.

CITIZEN'S TIME:

Glenwood Bear<sup>sp. Ke</sup> on how nice the name plates look and said Attorney Smith should have one also. He congratulated Mayor Terri Freeborn who had her picture on the front page of a local newspaper. He had also read a piece in the paper stating that Mr. Melton had been Mayor at one time; this was something that he was unaware of. Thinks that the Town Council should form a committee and go back as far as possible and obtain pictures of the Town's Mayors and starting this year, also pictures of the Council Members and Town Clerk to be hung in Town Hall, plus the Chief of Police. He still would like to see the Town purchase a Video Camera.

SIGN PERMITS:

Hancock made a motion to accept Marida Evans sign on the Madison Corner Shoppe if moved as suggested by the Planning Commission, this was seconded by Councilman John Kapp, the motion carried.

It was announced that Allrite Insurance Co. had left Town by Officer Amos Damron, so no sign would be needed.

Kapp made a motion to approve the sign for Haymarket Pharmacy, seconded by Steven Bean, the motion carried.

CODIFICATION OF ORDINANCES:

Mr. Smith mentioned that he had gotten the Ordinances back from Florida but had not had a chance to go over them completely. He recommended Council having Work sessions on the Ordinances and go thru them page by page. Mr. Smith will submit the Ordinances as soon as possible.

CLEANING TOWN HALL

Several bids were opened by the Mayor for cleaning Town Hall. Leon Kerns made a bid of \$100 per month, Charlotte Adams submitted a bid of \$40 per month. Councilman Steven Bean made a motion to accept Adams bid, this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried in a Roll Call Vote.

APPOINTMENT, HISTORIC LANDMARKS,

Charlotte Adams was appointed as Chairman to investigate Historic Landmarks in the Town of Haymarket.

Kapp made a motion to adopt the Resolution on the Rezoning of the Farr property, this was seconded by Bean, the Resolution was adopted.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Several Letters were read by Mayor Freeborn from Attorney Smith, one was regarding inoperative vehicles in Town. Mr. Smith did not find any Ordinances which specifically provides the control of the State Code having to do with the Town's controlling such matters. Should be considered when the new Ordinances are received. In the meantime Attorney Smith said if the Town desires him to take any action, he can do so by developing an ordinance which uses the authority provided for in the present State Code or prepare an Ordinance similar to the Prince William County Ordinance. Copy of this was given to him by Officer Amos Damron.

The Mayor also read a letter from Virginia Electric and Power Co. regarding an increase in their rates. This will be posted in Town Hall.

A letter from the Bureau of the Census was read. They would like to know how the Town intends to handle the Census? The last letter from them was turned over to Lorene Payne, Council suggested giving this one also to Lorene Payne and letting her get back to Council at the next meeting.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

A four and a half hour Viteo Course will be held on Wednesday, Aug 23, 1989, 11 a.m., at different locations by the Community Flood Plan Management.

Alexander and Alexander will hold a Seminar at the Marriott Hotel, Manassas, at 9 a.m. on Wednesday, May 17, 1989. Freeborn mentioned that she had been in touch with Mr. Yoho and if no one can attend the Seminars, he would meet with her or Council. It was suggested to ask him to come to a meeting or set some other time up to talk to Council

TRASH CONTRACT:

It was decided at the meeting not to put the Trash Contract out for bids but giving it to Everett Bean. Crouch voted to put it out for bids, Bean and Hancock had no opinion and Gossom and Kapp voted not to put it out for bids.

OTHER BUSINESS:

The Town Clerk announced that the extension given to the Lawn Ranger on their Business License will be up on 5/21/89. It was decided to send them a Certified Letter Stating this.

Kapp said a Lady had asked him about cleaning up the ditch across from Town Hall. Hancock will try to see Richard Bird this week regarding this. At this point, Mayor Freeborn asked Council to think about Titles by the next meeting of items for Council Members to be in charge of such as Highways, Health, etc.

Hancock brought up the subject of securing a Bullet Proof Vest for Officer Damron at a cost of approximately \$365.. Hancock made the motion on this, seconded by Bean, the motion carried.

A registered letter was to be sent to Town and Country Auto stating their Business License had not been paid.

A letter was to be sent to Jetco giving them 10 days to get the campers off the property.

Officer Amos Damron was going to ask the Highway Dept. to look into the Parking in front of Matthews Restaurant.

Regarding name plates for the Board of Zoning Appeals, Bean made a motion to have them made, seconded by Hancock, the motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT:

With no further business, Kapp made a motion at 9:47 p.m. to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Gossom, the motion carried.

for trash removal from the above named project will be in effect for one (1) year, beginning 7/24/89 and ending 7/24/90. This agreement will be automatically renewable for periods of one (1) year periods unless Thirty (30) day's notice is given by either party for termination at the end of the current period.

BEAN'S TRASH SERVICE and Town of Haymarket agree to the following terms:

1. Pick-up days will be on Tues. and X of each week.
2. Trash must be in containers or bags at the curb.
3. This pick-up is for household trash only. Larger items such as old furniture, old washing machines, etc., will be picked up on a special pre-arranged basis. This arrangement can be made by calling 703/754-~~7000~~<sup>0094</sup> in advance.
4. BEAN'S TRASH SERVICE is not responsible for lost containers.
5. The monthly fee is \$~~6.40~~<sup>8.00</sup> per unit.
6. The ~~Homeowner's Association~~<sup>Town</sup> agrees to absorb any increase in dump fees, ~~not to exceed 5% per annum~~, which may occur during the term of this agreement.
