The regular meeting of the Haymarket Town Council was brought to order on Sept. 15, 1980 at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Gilbertson. Council members present were Crouch, Gossom, Orndoff, and Smith. Absent were Bean and Crewdson. The meeting opened with prayer and the pledge. The minutes were read and accepted as corrected. The produce stand which was closed was at Deal's Market.

It was reported that well water or Madison Street was contaminated by bil from the well pump.

Mr. Rust came before the Council with a request from Mr. Charles Powell to change the lot line between his two properties, one of which has been sold. Zoning and subdivision requirements have been met. All that is neede is a deed of resolution showing the change.

The street light at Jordan Lane and Jefferson Street is not operating correctly. It turns off and on repeatedly.

The report on the damaged police cruiser was as follows. The car is totaled but can be sold for salvage. Mr. Orndoff suggested buying another in Richmond and keeping this one for parts. Mr. Jones said that another car is needed to check radar. Mr. Wright and Mr. Jones are now using their own personal cars.

Miss Smith made a motion to go into executive session to discuss a personnel matter on the basis of Sec. 2.1-3/4; subsection 1 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as amended. Mr. Gossom seconded and the m tion passed unanimously. Miss Smith neved to go back into regular session. Mr. Orndoff seconded and the motion carried. On returning to regular session, Miss Smith nominated Mr. Orndoff as Vice Mayor, Mr. Gossom seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Jones has applied for a Notary Public commission and asked for reimbursement from the Council. He was told to present the bill when received.

Mrs. Gilbertson asked for suggestions from the Council for someone to fill the chairman's vacancy on the Planning Commission.

Anne Smith asked about a noise ordinance in effect for the Town. The residents of Madison Street are being bothered by barking dogs and loud redios. There is no such ordinance by Turner Smith will see to it that the Council receives copies of pertinent ordinances which could be adopted for Haymarket.

It was reported that two tires on the police cruiser had been slashed and Mr. Wright had been threatened. The Commonwealth's Attorney should be notified of the threat. New tires will cost approximately \$75. Council approved the purchase of two new tires.

Mr. Orndoff would like to see some action token on the applicant for part time police officer. Mr. Jones will check on the cost of minimum police training and report back to the Council. Mr. Fasick will be encouraged to take the training and when done to reapply. At that time if he is hired the Town would reimburse his training costs.

Mr. Orndoff make a motion to buy another police cruiser from the Commonwealth. Mr. Gossom seconded. The motion carried with Mr. Gossom, Mr. Crouch, and Mr. Orndoff voting aye and Miss Smith abstaining.

Being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:50 p.m.
